Guilford ABC's "Secret Sauce"

or nearly 50 years, Guilford ABC (GABC) and the Hole in the Wall Consignment and Thrift Shop that provides much of the operating support for the program have been vital parts of our community. If you are reading this newsletter, you likely know that the program houses and provides academic support for talented young scholars of color who attend Guilford High School. You are probably aware that GABC is part of the national ABC program comprised of 322 programs located at member schools scat-

tered across the country. What you may not know is that GABC is one of only 20 Community School Programs (CSPs) where students attend highly rated public schools rather than private boarding or day schools. This distinction creates both challenges and opportunities for us.

Historically, one of the greatest challenges has been lack of awareness among incoming ABC scholars and their families that CSPs exist since we are such a small subset of the larger organization. This impacts recruitment of scholars who often don't consider GABC until late in the selection process, particularly when we are in competition with well-known, elite private schools. Fortunately, this is beginning to change as CSP leaders have begun meeting regularly with national ABC staff to share experiences and improve the marketing and visibility of our programs. At GABC, board members have created marketing materials and social media platforms that highlight our unique assets, including extensive advisory support, a family-like living environment, and a beautiful, accessible town.

What we hear from our current scholars affirms the value of these assets. When asked why she chose GABC over private boarding schools that offered her admission, sophomore Andrea Kaluma expressed her attraction to "the homey feel of the house when she first walked in," as well as the system of academic and student life advisors for each girl and easy availability of other academic support resources such as tutors and College Matters advising. GABC is also unique in its offering of financial and advisory support for summer experiences between academic years and college scholarships for alumnae.



With a near perfect track record for successful completion of college among our graduates, it is clear that the GABC program model is indeed a recipe for success. And from the perspective of GHS Principle, Julia Chaffe, the presence of our scholars is a win-win in our community!
